Bullying Free Week NZ - Week toru - 16 - 20 May

Bullying-Free New Zealand Week will be from 16-20 May in conjunction with Pink Shirt Day, on Friday. The week follows the theme *He kōtuinga mahi iti, he hua pai-ā rau: Small ripples create big waves.*

Bullying-Free NZ Week aims to raise awareness of how to prevent and respond to bullying in schools. The week provides an opportunity for schools to highlight their everyday work and focus on bullying prevention and awareness with students, staff, parents and whānau, and the whole school community.



Schools that encourage respect, value opinions, celebrate difference, and promote positive relationships make it difficult for bullying behaviour to thrive or be tolerated. To achieve this, it needs everyone – school staff, students, trustees, parents, whānau and communities – talking about the issue and working together. The theme provided a great opportunity for all members of your school community to talk about what bullying means to them and for schools to highlight their everyday work to counter bullying.

Why is this important?

Just like crayons we are all a little different. We live different lives and have different ideas, interests and experiences. Together we make the world a more vibrant place! What is bullying?

We hear the word bullying a lot. What is really important is that we understand what it is (and what it is not). When we all have a shared understanding of bullying, we can recognise it, deal with it when it happens and most of all stop it from happening in the first place.

One easy way to remember what makes something bullying is to remember the 3 P's from author, Signe Whitson¹.

It is bullying if:

- ⦿ It is done on **PURPOSE**; there is nothing "accidental" or unplanned about bullying.
- ⦿ It is a **PATTERN**; it happens over and over again.
- ⦿ It is all about **POWER**; one person (or a group) has more control and influence than their target.

Social Media and Young Children

Social Media has a profound impact on many of our lives. Often this has a positive impact, allowing connection and celebration. All too often it is a negative influence that can damage emotional wellbeing. In extreme cases it has contributed to conditions such as anxiety and depression.

We are often asked about social media and children. Our advice is to proceed with caution - if at all. Adult oriented sites such as Tik Tok, Facebook and Instagram have an age 13+ Restriction. Some games also are age restricted. For instance Minecraft is rated 7+, Roblox is rated 10+, Fortnite is 13+ These ratings are for valid reasons. By allowing your child to falsify their details to access these sites you are encouraging dishonesty and fraud. It can become really difficult to explain why this is acceptable online but not in other aspects of their lives. Again, John Parsons reminds us that our

values should be consistent wherever we are. John also strongly recommends that incidents of primary school children accessing R18 restricted content such as Grand Theft Auto, should be reported to the police.

Apps such as Kid Messenger are also problematic. They are explicitly targeted at 6 - 12 year olds, possibly to capture an ongoing social media market share for their designers. Even though this app is designed to be supervised by parents - it can still result in problems for young children. We have very young explorers worrying why someone hasn't messaged them or has blocked them - or misinterpreting what a message might 'really' mean. In our view our explorers don't need this - they are busy working on face to face connections and developing healthy friendships in the non digital world. Social media is complex and easy to get wrong. Many adults don't always get it right online! It is also very high stakes. Thanks to 'screen shots' whatever your child says or does online is potentially visible to everyone and forever. Of course your child will assure you that EVERYONE is on whatever the app or site may be. This is the time for you to be the parent and hold fast to what you know is right - as hard as this may be. Goodwood School Community Code of Conduct

Our teachers work to and achieve a demanding code of profession of values. They are a caring team who strive to do their best for explorers and whānau. Our school also has a helpful community code of conduct.

This has been included below, and is a useful guide of how we can best work together.

Waiho i te toipoto, kua i te toiroa. Let us keep close together, not wide apart.

Goodwood School is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for students, staff, and visitors.

Our Code of Conduct serves as a reminder to all parents, caregivers, and school visitors that their conduct must support everyone's emotional and physical wellbeing, and not harm it in any way.

The Code of Conduct applies:

- to all conduct, speech, and action, and includes emails, texts, phone calls, social media, or other communication
- while on school grounds or at another venue where students and/or staff are assembled for school purposes (such as a camp or sports match).

Standards of conduct

Goodwood School expects parents, caregivers, and visitors to:

- treat everyone with respect
- work together in partnership with staff for the benefit of students
- respect and adhere to our school values
- set a good example for students at all times
- follow school procedures to handle any complaints
- adhere to school policies and procedures (such as those listed below), and any legal requirements.

Examples of unsuitable conduct include:

- threats, bullying, harassment
- profanity/offensive language
- insulting, abusing, or intimidating behaviour
- racism or discrimination (e.g. based on ethnicity, religion)
- physical aggression
- deception/fraud
- damaging school property
- smoking, vaping, possessing, or using alcohol/drugs/other harmful substances on school premises or at another venue where students and/or staff are assembled for school purposes (except possession or use of alcohol in accordance with school policy)
- placing unreasonable and excessive expectations on staff time or resources
- pursuing a complaint or campaign, or making defamatory, offensive, or derogatory comments, regarding the school, its board, or any staff or students on social media or other public forums
- wearing gang insignia on the school grounds. (This is not allowed under the Prohibition of Gang Insignia legislation, and anyone wearing it will be asked to leave.)

Explorers, staff and community at Goodwood School are supported and protected by a comprehensive and robust set of policies. 


