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Tumuaki / Principal's Column

Kia Ora e ngā whānau me ngā hoa o te Kura Tuatahi o Goodwood.

Welcome to a brand new term!

The theme for this pānui is how we can work as a community to help keep each other safe and well. There is still significant illness present in our community with a particularly nasty strain of the flu, along with Covid 19 both doing the rounds. These illnesses are making some members of our school and wider whānau particularly unwell.

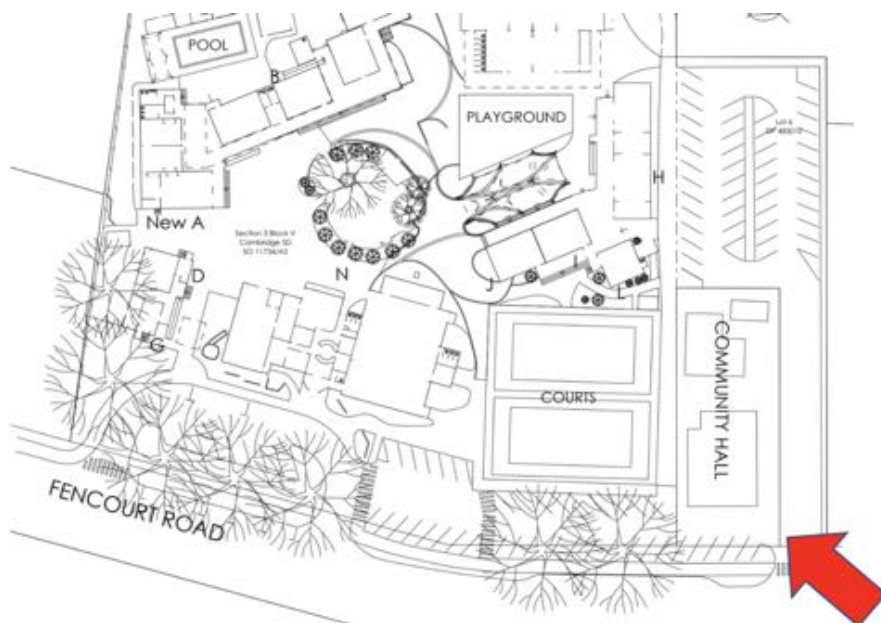
The Ministry of Health and Education have responded by **strongly recommending** that for the first 4 weeks of this term that children in year 4 and above, along with staff, wear face coverings in indoor areas. Our board of trustees has endorsed this strong recommendation. This helps to minimise transmission. The uptake of mask wearing has been low across our senior classes. The impact of this is increased risk of staff and explorer illness which will impact learning. Please encourage your year 4 and older explorers to wear face coverings

when indoors. We have supplies if needed. If you would like to insist that your child wears a face covering, please email your class teacher to let them know.

Each day we send between 3 to 6 explorers home who are not well enough to be at school. By this time they may have spread illness to others including our teaching team. At a time of increasingly reduced relieving teachers, it is important to keep children at home if they are unwell.

We are attempting to stretch out the learning day with a 3.00 pm finish for all explorers. We recognise that this is creating extra traffic congestion at 3.00 pm. Together we can do some things to mitigate this.

- 1) **Arrive between 3.10 and 3.15 pm for pick up.** Your explorer will be supervised on the turf and there will be many parking spaces available for you to use. **THIS WILL MAKE THE MOST SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCE.** Your explorers should pack a raincoat and / or umbrella
- 2) You are welcome to pick up from class at 3.00 pm or come onto the courts to collect your explorer.
- 3) If you are collecting your explorer at 3.00 pm - please leave promptly to free up your parking space.
- 4) **AVOID** stopping at the point marked by the red arrow or waiting in the driveway between the oak trees and the courts, Doing so causes traffic to back up along Fencourt Road, blocking the office exit and creating a loop of jammed traffic! Move through the driveway and try again or loop around the carpark.
- 5) **PLEASE DO NOT CALL YOUR CHILD ACROSS FENCOURT ROAD - THIS IS DANGEROUS!**
