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Tumuaki / Principal's Column

Kia Ora e ngā whānau me ngā hoa o Te Kura Tuatahi o Goodwood. Greetings to the Families and Friends of Goodwood School.

Last week I traveled to Wellington with 26 other Waikato principals to meet with the leaders of many organisations who support schools in Aotearoa. Our group met with...

- Lesley Hoskins, CEO of the Teaching Council.
- Ellen MacGregor, Acting Secretary for Education and her team.
- Gregor Fountain, Engagement manager of Sport NZ
- Leanne Otene, President New Zealand Principals Federation
- Stephanie Mills & Ripeka Lassells Leaders of the New Zealand Educational Institute
- Belinda Webber Chief Advisor Governance: New Zealand School Boards Association

The main points I took from the Tour were...

- 1. We are **exceptionally** well placed at Goodwood in terms of managing change and adapting to the demands of the refreshed curriculum. Thank you those who have helped us to unpack the changing curriculum and to refine our practice
- 2. ALL schools are working **VERY** hard, daily, to support learners with challenging learning and behavior needs. In many instances these are quite extreme. These needs continue to increase in number and complexity and require a community approach to achieve success.
- 3. There is a tension present in the capital for all peak bodies ahead of today"s budget. The Minister described it as the learning and behaviour support budget. We hope to see provision of the support that schools need.
- 4. There is a significant shortage of teachers in New Zealand at the moment. This coincides with record growth in our student population.
- 5. System wide data continues to highlight an urgent need for change. This includes our response to learning needs, attendance, mental health, bullying and achievement..


As a school and community, it is imperative that we continue to work together to support each other to achieve great outcomes for our explorers.

Teacher Only Day - Friday 13 June

Supporting attendance over winter

After School Care - update contacts / enrolments

Our enrolment forms have been updated recently to require people who are NOT allowed to collect your explorer to be listed, where applicable. If you need to add this information, please complete this new <u>ASC enrolment form</u> and return this to the school office.

If you need to update any of your other contact details, medical details for your explorer, or would like to enrol for the first time, please also complete the form and return this to the office.

Goodwood School's Before & After School Care is an approved OSCAR programme therefore families may apply for the 'Out of School Care and Recreation' (OSCAR) subsidy, a payment from WINZ which helps families with the costs of before and after school care.

If you are using Goodwood's Before & After School Care service for more than 3 hours per week (per child), and will continue to do so, now is a perfect time to check whether your family is eligible. Details about eligibility, how much you may get, and how to apply are available here:
